Activities of the project so far!

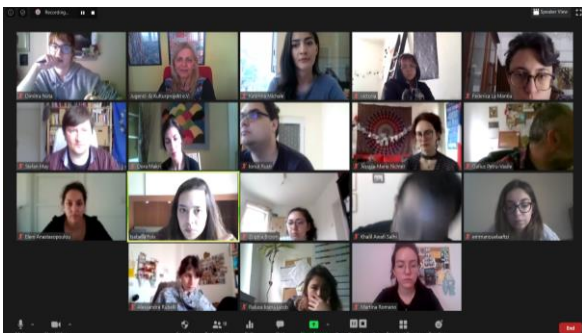
2nd Capacity Building Activity, in Palermo, Italy

The 2nd Capacity Building Activity took place in Palermo – Italy, from the 28th to 30th of October and was hosted by the Centro Per lo Sviluppo Creativo Danilo Dolci. The 3-day workshop entitled “How to become a PRIORITY Hub Super Hero” was focused on the following topics:

- How to approach youth at risk of marginalisation.
- Listing the set of instruments for youth workers to identify the main risks and barriers to social inclusion of young people in the local community.
- How to motivate young people at risk of marginalisation to participate and engage: designing and offering attractive activities towards youth.
- Planning the seed: how to create peer educators and multipliers among youth at risk of marginalisation.



3rd Capacity Building Activity, Online





The 3^o Capacity Building Activity entitled “How to Sustain Your PRIORITY Hub” was planned to take place in Dresden, Germany but, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the workshop was implemented online, from the 11th to the 15th of May 2020 and JKPeV hosted it. 18 participants from Italy, Greece, Poland and Germany gathered online and worked on the following topics:

- Strategic planning and enrichment of activities
- How to use creativity and technology to further develop a PRIORITY hub
- Expanding your network of cooperation and lobbying in a regional, national, EU level
- How to sustain financially a PRIORITY Hub and how to follow up
- Evaluate and redesign the strategy of a PRIORITY Hub

What we have recently achieved!

The project partners cooperated and developed:
